What life was like for children including looking at rationing, evacuation and The Blitz

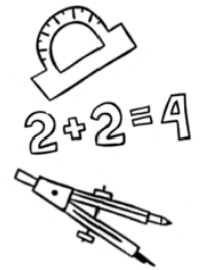
As Mathematicians this term...

Children learn how to: serve, forehand, backhand and volley.

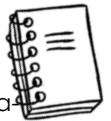


As Writers this term...
