




#### RECEPTION





Reception have had something exciting come into their classroom. They have really enjoyed watching the caterpillars grow and change and begin to form their chrysalis. They have loved observing the changes over time and we are really excited to see them hatch and become butterflies. We have our predictions on what colours they may be.







Year 1 really enjoyed our King Charles III learning week! We found out all about his life and his achievements. We also learnt about the Royal Family and discovered that Prince George will be the next in line to the Throne! We then made our own flower crowns in honour of King Charles being known as 'The Green King' and his love of the environment.



We have also been loving our Talk for Writing story: Whatever Next! Who knew you could make such fantastic rockets with cardboard boxes? The children had so much fun making their own rockets and acting out the story.



This week Year 2 have been very busy in our outdoor area. Our tulips bloomed into beautiful flowers and when we measured them, we identified the tallest tulip to be 35cm tall. We were so proud of the quality of our tulips that we decided to plant some individual pots with special seeds. We are hoping that they will bloom before the summer holidays.

For Cool Earth Day, we developed our knowledge about recycling as we were inspired by King Charles III's passion for looking after the environment. We used recycling brought in by children across the school to create a throne to commemorate the kings' coronation. We discussed the process of recycling and which materials can be recycled. After some reflection we decided on our own eco promises. Here are some brilliant examples of eco promises that Year 2 children came up with:

"I promise to recycle at home and in school."

"I will help the environment by picking up rubbish and putting it in the right bins."





Year 3 have enjoyed continuing their topic of the Ancient Egyptians. We had a go at mummifying oranges by cutting them open, scooping out the insides, filling it with salt and wrapping them in bandages. We also became immersed in our story where we became the scribe who helped lead the pharaoh into the afterlife using 'now press play'.



For our 'cool earth and coronation day' we learnt about King Charles III and his interest in growing food and eating organic food. We learnt all about what the word organic means and we tried a variety of organic and non – organic foods to see if we could taste a difference.

In maths we have been deepening our understanding of 'time'. We have been learning how to tell the time to the nearest minute on analogue and digital clock, as well as calculating durations and exploring the months in a year.



In writing, we are creating persuasive texts to sell a gadget. We have enjoyed story mapping and learning our key text 'The Multi-function Mobile Phone' which is essential for spies! We have practiced using a range of persuasive features such as rhetorical questions, boastful language, and imperative verbs.

The children have embraced the additional times-table practice and for many the time and effort is paying off with consistent results in Purple Math and Rockstar maths.

We continue to use our morning sessions to focus on our writing, reading and core maths. We have been writing our own portal stories and have written some fantastic stories of characters travelling to Ancient Maya through a variety of interesting portals. We will undertake the role of travel consultants to write a persuasive leaflet encouraging tourism to Ancient Maya – we already have a portal that will take us back in time.

In our reading lessons, we are reading myths and stories related to the Mayan civilisation. We have been justifying our personal viewpoint referring to the text to support our argument.

We will continue to use our afternoons to look at times-tables in a more lighthearted way until the statutory assessment in June. We are working in small groups so that children can build their recall of facts or deepen their understanding by applying known facts to reasoning and problem-solving challenges.

The Coronation and Cool Earth Day was enjoyed by the children.



We found out more about the ceremonial crown jewels and the Prince's Trust; some children shared their research in assembly. The children designed a flower themed throne.




We made seed paper that will biodegrade in a flower bed or grassed area.




Year 5 have worked hard on Area and Perimeter in maths, demonstrating good use of strategies and showing their workings. We have even completed some challenging problems linked to real life!




We are looking forward to using Modroc in art and getting messy and completing our science unit on forces, before moving onto properties and changes of materials!

#### YEAR 6F




This week has been a bit different to last!

We have found out amazing facts and are going to use them as well as our SPAG skills to create informative biographies.




