We began this half term celebrating Halloween with the children through a disco and everyone had such fun. What a start to the term.




AUTUMNAL ACROSTICS!


Why not have a go at writing your own autumnal acrostic poem.

MATHS

Maths activity to try at home or as a family

At the zoo, there are many different types of animals. Some have 2 legs, some have 4 legs, some have more than 4 legs and some have none at all!


COMPUTING

In computing, the children have been exploring coding.

This is a very exciting strand of computing as they get to explore how inputting instructions in the computer will make something move, change colour or even speak.

The children learn how to include different controls into their creations and ways to simplify algorithms using repeat and if/else commands. Coding will be our key strand for the rest of this half term.

6 TIPS TO KEEP KIDS SAFE ON TIKTOK

- 1. Adjust your child's privacy settings
- 2. Manage comments
- 3. Set time limits

6 Tips to Keep Kids Safe on TikTok

- 1. **Adjust your child's privacy settings.** For kids under 16, we recommend setting their account to private. With a private account, only users you approve can follow you and view your videos. Let them interact with only people they know in real life (and celebrities you approve of).
- 2. **Manage comments.** Tell your kids never to read the comments or disable them entirely. This is one way to manage that external validation piece and to protect them from online bullying and predators.
- 3. **Set time limits.** While many are relaxing time limits during quarantine, boundaries are good to keep a healthy balance.
- 4. **Communicate.** Communication is so important, keep talking to your kids so they know they can come to you if they have a problem.
- 5. **Check followers.** Keep an eye on who is following your kids if you let them go on the app without you.
- 6. **Scroll together.** Predators have been known to manipulate their content so it lands on kids' *For You* page. Consider keeping the app on your phone instead and enjoy videos together as a family.

SPORT and PE

Reception are really looking forward to taking part in a dance unit this half term. They will be exploring movements to music and creating a dance following the theme of bonfire and fireworks.





Year 1 are also looking forward to starting their gymnastics unit. They will be looking at different movements and stretches.


SCIENCE, DESIGN and TECHNOLOGY

In forest school, we have had opportunities to explore wildlife when pond dipping and we have explored how some of these creatures have adapted over time.





You can practise this song at home with them... ask them to show you the actions!




MINDFULNESS and WELLBEING






GEOGRAPHY
