Visit your local town/city centre

Walk from your home to school, noticing features along the way.

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As readers and writers this term...

We will...

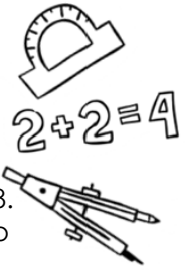
- Develop our ability to 'Fred talk' (sound out) 3 and 4 letter words when reading.
- Learn to recognise the set 1 special friends sh, th, ch, ng, nk, qu.
- Learn to read red words: I of my to the no.
- Apply our phonics skills to write words and begin to use these within simple supported sentences



As mathematicians this term...

We will be

- Developing an understanding of 0
- Compare numbers to five using the language 'more than, fewer than and equal to'
- Growing our understanding of 6, 7 and 8.
- Explore and compare items in relation to mass and capacity.



To develop our physical skills...

We will...

- Complete activities that strengthen our core muscles.
- Develop our understanding of spatial awareness and move with more accuracy and coordination.
- Develop our pencil grip so that we are using 3 fingers and thumb more comfortably.
- Practise and refine our letter formation.
- Develop scissor skills to cut zig zags and curves.

As communicators...

We will...

- Use words to describe the environment (inside and out).
- Respond and ask questions about our locality and describe the area around our school.
- Use words to describe our country and the animals native to the UK.
- Ask and respond to questions about what the weather is like in our country.
- Compare UK to Africa and describe Africa's climate and animals.

To help us understand the world around us we will...

- Explore our locality from our school to the local community around us discussing the key features and animals.
- Explore what Africa is like and compare this to England.
- Begin to use and understand simple maps.

To develop our personal & emotional skills...

We will...

- Recognise our feelings.
- Begin to initiate turn taking with less adult support.
- Develop concentration for longer periods of time.

As artists this term...

We will...

- Use African textiles to create repeated patterns by printing with found objects.
- Use tools with increasing accuracy.
- Use a tab to attach two materials.
