#### RECEPTION





Reception have really enjoyed having year 6 come to join us each day. It has been lovely to see the new friendships formed and how they interact with one another. They have been enjoying reading with their partners, learning number bonds and flashing phonics cards. Year 6 have really helped Reception become more confident with these skills.



Year 1 have had a fabulous few weeks! In talk for writing, we learnt to retell the 'Elves and the Shoemaker' story and we have even had a shoe workshop in our classroom! The children enjoyed making their own shoes and they came up with some creative ideas!



We have also had some 'Off the Trolley' music sessions where we had the chance to explore the instruments and the sounds they make. We focused on loud/quiet and fast/slow. The children then got into groups and made up their own songs. We had so much fun!



Year 2 have been developing their needlework skills in DT to create seasonal coasters. We chose the colours of the squares based on colours we associate with different seasons throughout the year and designed our coasters in our books. We have been developing our confidence in using running stitches to create the squares on our binka material. We then stuck our binka onto cork to create our coasters. Here are some of the children's opinions on this process; "It is relaxing, and I liked choosing the colours!" "It made me calm and happy," "I want to keep getting even better."

For Art we have been learning about Antony Gormley and how he is influenced by the face and body to creates sculptures. We used a range of tools to experiment creating different textures on clay to add details. We then developed our modelling skills by making pinch pots and then used the techniques we had developed when making these, to create little sculptures of animals. The best part was using the tools we had experimented with to add the textured details onto our animals.

We started off our new writing unit linked to the book, 'Fantastic Mr Fox' by conducting a Q and A session where the children were in the 'Hot Seat' as Fantastic Mr Fox and were being asked questions by the interviewer. The children had to use their knowledge of Fantastic Mr Fox to answer questions on general knowledge of foxes and to support their imaginations.







In Science this term, year 3 have been learning all about forces and magnets. We have conducted investigations to compare how things move on different surfaces. We have also explored magnets and learnt that they have two 'poles' that can attract and repel. We had a go at organising different materials based on if they were attracted to a magnet or not, and in doing so identified magnetic materials.





In maths we have been investigating mass, capacity, and volume. We have learnt how to read a variety of scale, to accurately measure in grams and kilograms as well as millilitres and litres. We can compare values of mass as well as volume and capacity. We can also use our formal methods of addition and subtraction to add and subtract units of measurement.

During our writing lessons we have been writing for the purpose of explaining. We have looked at a variety of Wallace and Gromit's 'cracking contraptions' and used our writing skills to explain how these contraptions work.

We have also been looking after our minds and engaging with mindfulness activities. We used paperclips to be still and focus on linking and unlinking them. We then used the paperclips to create our own images.



The times table assessments are now complete with all children showing progress throughout the year in securing their knowledge of times-tables to 12. Whilst the focus is reduced, we will continue to encourage children to keep these facts fluid as they support general maths learning throughout their schooling.


In reading lessons, we are enjoying a new suspense short story called 'Cogston House'. We are finding lots of cliffhangers keeping us guessing about what will happens next.

Our current writing is also supported by the 'Cogston Hall' text, we are writing a narrative that has detailed setting descriptions and uses figurative language and speech to provide rich character descriptions.

> We have begun a seven-week cricket course on Thursday afternoons – we are focusing on a new skill each week and are all enjoying these sessions immensely.

In science, we are looking at the topic of sound. We successfully completed a whole lesson without uttering a single word whilst recording other sounds we could hear in various locations around the school.

In PSHE we are working on the 'Economics' aspect by considering the role of money and how we keep track of spending.



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
The theme in art is Cath Kidston – the children are using her London inspired prints to create their own Mayan pattern design.







Over the last few weeks, we have been working hard, securing our knowledge of angles, through looking at the angles in triangles and quadrilaterals. We have also moved on to deepen our knowledge of converting units of measurement, for example grams to kilograms - we have really grasped this!



During the afternoons we have had fun in DT, making Anglo-Saxon cuffs – we threaded needles and tied knots which was the tricky part! We have used running stitch, back stitch, and cross stitch to create decorations and patterns. We will be selling our cuffs at the summer fayre for £2.00 – so please bring your change and treat yourself to a fashionable and unique cuff which will enhance any outfit!



We have had a busy few weeks, working hard and enjoying our learning. We are so proud of the children and the amazing writing that they have produced over the year – they have worked so hard!


