As the colder weather rolls in, please remember to send your child/ren in with a named coat and hat/gloves/scarf as we are often exposed to the elements.












Reception have been learning all about our families and our pets. We have explored the different family members in our families and how these can look the same or different to their friends. They really enjoyed creating family trees to represent the key people in our lives. We have also really enjoyed drawing pictures of our family in the creative area where we looked at the key colours for our hair and eye colour.

In talk for writing we have learnt both the stories Mr Wiggle and Mr Waggle and The Squeaky Story. Reception have been working really hard to draw key characters from each story and add in key sounds which we have been learning. We have enjoyed practicing our actions to the story and confidently retelling this to our friends. See if your child can retell you these stories at home.





YEAR 1

Over the last couple of weeks, Year 1 have been focusing on the text 'Not now, Bernard'. The children have innovated the story and created their own character to write about, immersing themselves in the creative area. We have also really enjoyed learning about our city in our Geography unit. We visited the library where we learned a lot about Worcester before our time.

As Mathematicians we have been developing our knowledge of numbers using part-part whole models. The children have used a range of resources to support and apply their learning.

In Science, we have been learning about minibeasts and how to identify them. The children have explored their environments, searching for minibeasts.



YEAR 2 NEWSLETTER AUTUMN

Well done for some incredible learning in Year 2. So far we have enjoyed writing about Silly Billy and creating Worry Dolls. We are now telling the story of Little Red Riding Hood and changing the story with new characters and events. We have started counting in 2s 5s and 10s in maths and have started exploring counting in 3s. We have created Calligram poems and learned about living things in our environment.







We are starting to learn about London being our capital city, and in history we will learn about the great fire of London. We will continue to investigate living things in our environment and begin painting in the style of artist Stephanie Roberts.

What We've Learned

Handball

The children have enjoyed learning the skills required to play a game of handball. We have been practising aiming, the power of our throw and dribbling.

Column Method

We have been learning to add and subtract two three-digit numbers using column method. We are beginning to look at exchanging and regrouping using base 10 to support.

Science

We have been continuing to explore plants in science. We have been looking at how seeds are dispersed in order for plants to regrow. Did you know strawberries are the only fruit with seeds on the outside?

YEAR 4 NEWSLETTER'

What we have been up to...

As mathematicians, we have been continuing our work on place value. The children have been exploring numbers up to 10,000 and are doing fantastically well! This week, we have focused on comparing and ordering numbers using our place value knowledge.

As writers, we are learning how to make our sentences more effective and descriptive. We've been practising using expanded noun phrases, similes, prepositional phrases, and adverbial phrases in our writing.

The children have continued practising their passing and control skills in football. We have also just started our swimming lessons, which the children have loved! We are focusing on front crawl, particularly where our feet should be and how our arms enter and exit the water. We also practised one of our key skills of star floats which was a big hit!

This week, as artists, the children thoroughly impressed me with their Emily Gravettinspired drawings of her signature wolf. They used hatching and cross-hatching techniques learned over the past few lessons, and were very proud of their work!

YEAR 5

It has been a very busy couple of weeks in Year 5 and we have been diving into lots of exciting new learning across all our subjects.

In our topic lessons, we've moved onto our new unit My Place, My Time. Our main focus is geography, where we've been learning about the different climate zones around the world. We've also been discovering what it means to live in a temperate climate and how this affects our daily lives.

In P.E., we've been developing our netball skills, learning how to move into space, pass accurately and work as a team. Our dance lessons have been inspired by Roman soldiers, linking to our upcoming history topic. We've been practising moving in unison and formation, just like soldiers would have done!



In music, we've been exploring the connection between sound and colour, discovering how both can express emotions and moods.



Meanwhile, in art, we've been inspired by Henri Rousseau's beautiful jungle paintings. We've been experimenting with watercolours, learning how to create different hues, match colours, and use layering to add depth to our artwork.

In maths, we've been working hard on developing our formal methods for addition and subtraction with numbers up to the millions. We're now feeling confident and are looking forward to applying these skills to tricky word problems.

In writing, we've enjoyed reading a story called *Bling*, which has helped us practise creating subordinate clauses and varying them within our sentences. On Poetry Day, we had a wonderful time learning about Cinquain poems and even performed some of our own—what a creative and confident bunch we are!

We welcomed Severn Arts who did a workshop with Year 5 to create digital art which will appear as part of an art installation called Bridges of Light. Watch this space for how you can see their artwork illuminating Worcester bridge!



Year 6 have had a jam-packed few weeks! Check out our learning below!

As mathematicians, we have been consolidating our place value knowledge as well as using this add and subtract including using this in varying contexts. While working with decimals we used place value charts to help us perfect our strategies before using these in our books within a range of contexts.



We love reading! We've being enjoying a range of texts in reading, writing and through our topic. We loved having adults in for DFAR time last week.









As Scientists, we have been exploring the circulatory system. In our most recent session, we explored the components of blood and represented each part using sweets which will help us to remember each part!
