

Nursery have had a fantastic time embracing all things Autumn. We have learnt about fireworks, light and autumn colours.

Bonfire night was an exciting time in Nursery. We talked lots about what we see and ensuring we stay safe. We painted our own fireworks using paint and we also made our very own bonfire. We also got messy and made sparklers using breadsticks, icing and sprinkles.


Moving on to Autumn, we enjoyed discussing as a class what changes we can see within our environment. We found that the leaves were changing colour and were starting to fall off the trees. We also noticed it was getting cold and children were starting to wear their hats, gloves and scarfs. We spoke about what autumnal fruits and vegetables we see. We identified apples, pears, plums, blackberries, pumpkins, carrots and potatoes. We embarked on a leaf hunt and made a collage using the autumnal things we found. We also incorporated pinecones, acorns and conkers into our playdough which allowed the children to create some unique autumnal masterpieces.

We have had a fantastic time getting into the autumnal spirit and cannot wait to welcome the Christmas period.

RECEPTION

Reception have had a very busy few weeks.

We have started to learn our songs for our nativity and we cannot wait to perform this for you.



In Maths, we have been learning all about numbers 4 and 5 and practiced partitioning our numbers. For example, $2 + 2 = 4$.

In PE we have been joining in with our dance unit of moving to music and creating a sequence of movements to retell a story based around Bonfire Night.

In Art we have been exploring our skill of painting. We have looked at Jackson Pollocks artwork and used a variety of techniques to practice making marks. We enjoyed collaborating making our very own version of Jackson Pollock's artwork on a big sheet.

Reception have had lots of fun learning our new story The Gingerbread Man. We have begun to retell the story using our actions. Within the construction area we have been building a home for him, in the playdough station we have made our own gingerbread man and within the creative area we have designed our own versions.

YEAR 1

This term, Year 1 have been learning all about 2D and 3D shapes. We went on a shape hunt around school, exploring all the different shapes that make up the world around us. We applied our learning to lots of different activities, such as building 3D shapes using lolly pop sticks, and discovering which shapes are the best at stacking, to build a tower.



In PE, we have started our Gymnastics unit. We have learned how to correctly take off and land. Also, they explored making different shapes in the air when jumping off a low apparatus.

Furthermore, we have been excited and proud of our artwork. We experimented with clay, using different tools to create marks in the clay. This is to ensure we use the correct tools to create our final piece, which is a shop, inspired by the Highstreet.



YEAR 2 NEWSLETTER AUTUMN 2



Welcome back to our second half term in Year 2. We have done some lovely writing about one of our key authors texts Into The Forest. We are exploring what it means to be a hero with *A Hero Called Wolf*. We have been completing addition and subtraction problems using number bonds to 10 and 100 to help us.

Along with learning about London being our capital city, in History we have been learning about The Great Fire of London and have enjoyed a role play bakery. The class loved the opportunity to be able to create salt dough with grown ups. We have begun exploring paints and different methods of using paintbrushes to create work similar to Stephanie Peters. In PE we've shown great skills and balance controlling a ball and bat. We have started practicing our nativity and can't wait to share this with you all soon!

YEAR 4 NEWSLETTER

What we have been up to...

Maths

As mathematicians, we have been learning all about area and how to compare it. To make this concept come alive, the children enjoyed a hands-on activity using sticky notes. They created different rectilinear shapes and discovered that while the shape can change, the area stays the same.

Writing

As writers, we have started exploring the Great Kapok tree as our key text. We've been working hard to improve our sentences by using adverbials and fronted adverbials.

Reading

Our class is diving into the journey of the centre of the earth which is our new book. We love performing reader's theatre and have begun using thinking aloud strategies to help us understand the text better. The children are really engaging with the story and its adventurous characters.

Science

As scientists we have been learning all about living things and their habitats. We've taken our learning outdoors, conducting surveys to discover what wildlife and habitats exist right here at Camforth! The children especially enjoyed singing our vertebrates and invertebrates song - it's a class favourite.

YEAR 5


What a fantastic and busy start to the term we've had in Year 4! The children have settled in brilliantly and are embracing all the new challenges we've set them. We have plunged straight into our new history topic, **The Romans in Britain!** This unit has been a wonderful way to reactivate the children's knowledge of the **Iron Age** and the pre-Roman context of Britain. We are exploring some really big ideas, including what defines an **empire** and a **civilisation**, and what the Romans brought with them.

In **Maths**, our focus has been developing the children's understanding of **multiplication**. They are now confidently applying these skills to new concepts, specifically identifying **multiples** and finding **factors** of numbers. We have been very much enjoying using **Magma Maths** as part of our lessons, which helps to consolidate and deepen their understanding in a fun, active way.

In **Writing**, we have been exploring the hilarious and engaging text, **The Day the Crayons Quit**. The children have loved stepping into the "shoes" of the different unhappy crayons! Our key grammatical focus has been on using **relative clauses** to add extra, detailed information into our sentences. They will soon be using all their skills to write a **persuasive letter** to Duncan, telling him how they are feeling as crayons and convincing him to make some changes.

We have begun our **Hockey** unit in **P.E.**, and the children are showing fantastic teamwork and enthusiasm. We are focusing on developing foundational skills such as **dribbling**, **passing**, and **tackling**, and learning how to hold the stick in a **stable way** to improve both control and accuracy.

Finally, in **Science**, we have started our new topic on the animal kingdom. We are learning all about **animals in their habitats** and how different creatures are adapted to their environments. We have also started the fun and fascinating work of **creating life cycles** for various animals.



YEAR 6

We have had an action-packed two weeks of this half term and there is more to come!

We are so pleased with how settled Year Six are and trying hard with their learning attitude – keep it up!

Last week, we undertook some assessments which the children showed great resilience towards – we were very proud.

As geographers, we have been exploring biomes. A biome is a large geographical region with a specific climate, vegetation, and animal life. We ventured into the forest school area to find evidence of our biome – temperate forest. Ask us why!



As Historians, we loved our **WOW -IN** day where we could dress in relation to our topic – King John. We thoroughly enjoyed finding out more and using interpretation to find out more about him. We also enjoyed being joined by our parents where we created our own illustrated letters.








Attendance

Punctuality matters!

Being frequently late for school adds up to lost learning:

- Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year.
- Arriving 15 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 2 weeks a year.
- Arriving 30 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 19 days a year.


19 days lost a year through being late means 90% attendance.
